In the EU and in Hungary Hybrid Conference on Housing

The Institute of Social Democracy in co-operation with the Foundation for European Progressive Studies is organizing a conference on European housing practices with outstanding international experts, politicians of Hungarian opposition and representatives of Hungarian housing NGOs to talk about what needs to be done and specific ideas for action.

The housing crisis affects about a third of the population. Millions struggle financially with housing hundreds of thousands live in uncomfortable homes and more than 60% of children live in overcrowded homes. The parties of democratic opposition want to change and improve this serious and comprehensive social problem and the goal is to achieve a real, responsible housing policy in Hungary that reduces social disparities and provides affordable housing and responds to environmental and climate protection issues. On our end housing policy is given a prominent place and responsibility in the government structure, in which the primary task is governmental coordination of housing issues and the development of a long-term public housing vision and strategy based on broad expert and social consensus and research and practical implementation.
