International Conference Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia looking ahead: the momentum to catch the EU train

Background and aims of the conference

Hopes are high that with the new progressive government led by Prime Minister Zoran Zaev, sworn in on the 1st of June 2017, the political situation in Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia - characterized by growing authoritarianism, corruption, mass street protest, physical attack on MPs in the parliament and standstill in EU integration – is about to change. The first test was passed: After the finalization of the two local election rounds, Zaev's Social Democratic Union of Macedonia (SDSM) won in 57 municipalities, including the City of Skopje. The new government presented the "plan 3-6-9", which aim was to re-start the reform process and return the country to the Euro-Atlantic path. The successful implementation of the plan was noted in the latest report of the European Commission: Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia achieved significant progress in implementing the urgent reform priorities and has largely overcome the political crisis. The assessments of the political criteria, in particular the judiciary and the public administration, are very positive. What remains is further work on alignment with EU policies and legislation, to deepen the current reforms on urgent reform priorities, as well as to strengthen access to the judiciary, fundamental rights, justice, freedom and the security of the country. Finally, on 12 June 2018 Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia set a first step in de-blocking the Euro-Atlantic integration by signing a name deal with Greece. Conservative Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia President Ivanov and a referendum in fall 2018 on the new name seem to be the final obstacles of Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia's EU and NATO integration. The main aim of the conference is to bring together progressive parties, political foundations, civil society, academia and other stakeholders from EU, Western Balkans countries and Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, in order to discuss and develop strategies for the European and Euro-Atlantic integration and sustainable democratization of Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and the countries of South East Europe.
